OUR CHRISTIAN VALUES

Our school values seek to underpin the Christian belief that we are all God's people and that we all matter. We treat every child with the dignity and respect they deserve as children of God. We believe that everyone within our school family should be valued and treated with love and respect and that each of us has the right to grow and become the best version of ourselves. Likewise, we believe that we each have a responsibility to show respect and tolerance towards each other. Our shared core values are central to what we believe within school and permeate our daily work, interactions, relationships and the decisions we make. These values are taught across the school year and are linked with parables and stories relevant to the Church calendar.





ADMISSION TO OUR SCHOOL

The Governors have an agreed admission policy, which sets out the criteria applied when parents request a place at the school. A full copy of this policy is available from the Office Manager. Nursery children start part-time or full-time (subject to eligibility), in the Foundation Stage Unit, the term after they are three years old. Reception age children start full-time education in September of the school year in which they become five. Children of all faiths and of none are welcome at this school.

THE SCHOOL DAY

The school day for children in Reception to Year 6 starts at **8.45am** and finishes at **3.15pm**.

Children in all year groups have playtime in the morning and afternoon sessions.

Punctuality is important. The school doors are closed at **8.45am**. If your child arrives after this time adults must come in to reception via the main gates to sign their child in.

Please inform the school if you are delayed in picking up your child or if someone unknown to the school is to collect them.



NURSERY

All children aged 3 are eligible for 15 hours FREE childcare, we offer the following sessions:

Morning session: 8.45am - 11.45am

We also offer 30 hours FREE childcare (subject to eligibility) as follows:

5 full days: 8.45am - 3.15pm

Chargeable term time before and after Nursery care is available from 7.30am - 6.00pm at our Trinity Plus out of school care club. Please ask for further details.





ATTENDANCE

Prompt and regular attendance is vital for your child to make progress. It is very important that you notify school immediately of **any** absence including a **full reason** of why your child is absent. You can contact the school by email on office@trinity.bradford.sch.uk or by phoning the main school number 01274 564977 (selecting option 1) no later than **9:00am**.



The school operates the 'Keep Kids Safe Primary Contact' system within school. If your child is absent from school, and you have not informed school with a reason why, we will contact you via phone, email or SchoolPing. Home visits will also be conducted where necessary.

HOLIDAYS IN TERM TIME

There is no entitlement to time off in term time.

The school strongly discourages pupils taking holidays in term time.



It is our policy, in line with the government's and LA's guidance, that holidays/extended leave of absence **will not** be authorised. If you remove your child from school without the Headteacher's permission a '**Request for a Penalty Notice for unauthorised term time leave of absence**' will be issued to Bradford Children's Services.

All leave of absence requests must initially be made on an official 'Application for Leave of Absence From School' form and must be received by school at least 4 weeks before the date of the absence.

UNIFORM

The school uniform comprises:

- Reception to Year 5: Purple jumper or cardigan (with embroidered school logo)
- Year 6: Navy jumper or cardigan (with embroidered school logo)
- Reception to Year 5: Purple and white gingham summer dress
- Year 6: Navy and white gingham summer dress
- Plain black school footwear
- Purple book bag or rucksack (with or without embroidered school logo)

PE EQUIPMENT

- Black or navy shorts / skirt / joggers / leggings - unbranded
- White t-shirt (with or without school logo - unbranded)
- Black or navy hoodie
- Black pumps (indoor PE) / trainers (black, white or navy are preferable)
- Trainers for outdoor PE
- KS2 only: outdoor kit - Black or navy tracksuit (unbranded & without hood)

Please label ALL items of clothing clearly with your child's name so that we can easily identify and return lost items of clothing.

SWIMMING EQUIPMENT - Year 3 Pupils

- Girls: one piece costume (not a bikini or tankini)
- Boys: trunks or swimming shorts
- Also a pair of goggles, towel and a waterproof bag to carry kit
- Coats are needed in cold weather for travelling to and from the pool

WEARING JEWELLERY

Children should not wear jewellery, other than a watch and one pair of stud earrings. Any earrings that are not studs will be removed.

ALL jewellery worn in school must be removed for PE and swimming. Teachers are not permitted to help with removal of earrings. If your child is unable to remove them independently, please ensure they do not wear jewellery on PE days.

CURRICULUM

EYFS

The EYFS curriculum is designed to support children's healthy development and provide the foundation children need to make the most of their abilities and talents as they grow up. Children learn skills, acquire new knowledge and demonstrate their understanding through 7 areas of learning and development, these are split into Prime and Specific areas. It is designed to be flexible so that staff can follow your child's unique needs and interests, while also teaching them the most important skills and knowledge to prepare them for future learning.

YEARS 1-6

The core subjects taught in school are English, Maths, Science and RE. The curriculum is based on key texts to give a meaningful context in which children can learn. Weekly timetables also include History, Geography, Music, Art, Design Technology, Computing, Physical Education, PSHE and Modern Foreign Languages.

Curriculum coverage is displayed on our website half-termly to enable parents to be well-informed about the skills their children are developing.

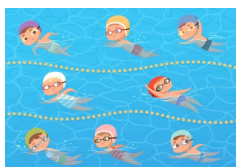
RELATIONSHIPS AND SEX EDUCATION (RSE)

At Trinity All Saints Church of England Primary School, we deliver relationships and sex education through the Personal, Social, Health and Education (PSHE) lessons as well as the Science curriculum. Some aspects of RSE such as reproduction and life cycles will be covered in gradually increasing detail in the statutory science national curriculum. Before the end of KS2 pupils are provided with information about how their body works and changes as they reach puberty and adulthood.

WIDER AND EXTENDED CURRICULUM

MUSIC LESSONS

Rocksteady Music lessons are currently available (there is a charge for this service). For further information, please contact the school office. KS2 pupils have the opportunity to join the school choir.



SWIMMING

We believe that learning to swim is an essential part of a pupil's education and during Year 3 children take part in swimming lessons.

CLUBS

We run a variety of clubs for pupils to take part in at lunchtimes and after school. Clubs may change from term to term. Information about the clubs to be run will be sent home before the beginning of each term. A charge may be associated with some clubs.



SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS AND DISABILITIES (SEND)

All children have individual needs, but some children may require additional support. After discussion with parents/carers, a child with such needs will be supported in their learning and a plan put in place. This will be carefully monitored to ensure progression and parents will be kept informed about their child's development. Sometimes difficulties will be resolved by this extra support. If, however, we feel that a child's needs require additional help from an outside agency, we will seek parents' agreement before contacting the appropriate support agency.

If you are aware of any worries your child may have about their work at school, please contact us and let us know - a little bit of extra support and encouragement can often overcome a problem in its early stages.

PARENT CONSULTATIONS

Consultation evenings with your child's class teacher are held in both the Autumn and Spring terms to discuss your child's progress and share future targets.

In the Summer Term a written report is sent home and parents are welcome to come and discuss its contents if they wish to do so.

In addition, there are opportunities for parents to meet class teachers on a more informal basis when picking up their child at the end of the day.

HOMEWORK

All pupils are expected to read (ideally daily) at home, learn their spellings and times tables.

In addition pupils will be given suggestions as to how they can use independent research to find out more about subjects being taught in school. The 'topic' style homework places the onus on pupils to take responsibility for their learning. Any research brought into school is highly valued and celebrated.





SCHOOL VISITS AND CHARGING FOR SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

The school is committed to arranging educational visits (including visitors to school and workshop based events) to enhance and enrich the curriculum. Many of these are purposefully designed to develop our pupils' self esteem and social skills. These culminate in a Year 6 residential aimed to prepare pupils for the challenge and expectations of secondary school.

Parents/carers may be asked to contribute to the cost of some of these activities in order for them to be possible.





BEHAVIOUR IN SCHOOL



The school expects pupils to behave in a sensible and responsible way, showing consideration for all members of the school community. Rules are kept to a minimum, and are put in place to maintain a safe environment for everyone.

We give priority to promoting high standards of behaviour and work, and we reward pupils when they do well. Friday morning achievement assemblies are centred round sharing good work, manners and behaviour and recognising effort in all areas of school and home life.

RESTORATIVE PRACTICE

The school approaches all conflict using restorative practice techniques. Children are taught not to blame but to resolve problems by taking responsibility for their actions and words in a respectful and considerate environment.



EXCLUSION



Where children have extremely challenging behaviour, they are given a special behaviour support programme to help them to manage their behaviour. Where children persistently disrupt the learning or health and safety of others, an exclusion may be necessary. However, this is only taken if all other strategies have been exhausted.

Written notification of any exclusion is always given to parents, the Chair of Governors, Education Bradford and Education Welfare Officers. Every help will be given to explain the action and parents' rights in the matter.

COMPLAINTS PROCEDURE

We hope that your child will have a happy and constructive time with us at school.

However, should you feel that it is necessary to make a complaint about the school, we would ask you to follow the complaints procedure outlined in the complaints policy (a link to which is found on the school website) to ensure that your complaint is heard and dealt with fairly.





ILLNESS AND ACCIDENTS

Growing Together

Illness in school is sometimes unavoidable and although we do our best when your child is ill in school there is no comfortable place for children to rest. In cases where we suspect illness you will be contacted by telephone.

We have several qualified first-aiders who deal with minor accidents such as 'bumps and bruises' in school. If any first aid is administered, or your child receives a bump on the head, you will receive a note from the first aider. In the event of a more serious accident, we would contact a parent directly by telephone, and arrange for a child to be taken to hospital. We do need to have an emergency telephone number kept up to date for every child in school. Please contact the school office if you change your telephone number.


Please let us know what action should be followed if your child has any known physical problems that may need treatment in school.

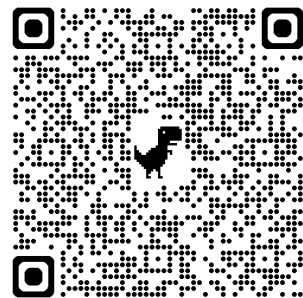
If your child is not feeling well, it is advisable to keep them at home as it can be distressing for a child to be ill at school.

Please inform school straight away if your child is going to be away from school, including the nature of the illness and how long they are going to be away.

Children with sickness and/or diarrhoea should remain at home and be clear of symptoms for 48 hours before returning to school.

Additionally, other contagious illnesses could require your child to remain at home for the advised time. Please refer to the NHS guidance by scanning the QR code.

WELCOME TO OUR NURSERY



My name is Ava Golledge and I am the Nursery Teacher. In the bright and welcoming environment of our nursery, we aim to make your child's early years of school life a happy and enjoyable experience.

Our core focus in nursery is the daily emotional, social and personal needs and interests of your child. As mothers ourselves we understand the need for care and support in daily activities such as learning to make friends, toileting, and maintaining good behaviour. Our ultimate goal is to facilitate the process of making confident and self assured individuals who respect others and are happy and eager to learn.



Your child's nursery education is a very important start for your child as research has proved that a child who has received a good quality nursery education can expect to have a higher attainment in later school years. At Trinity All Saints Nursery we actively promote good learning dispositions.

We aim to foster a love of reading through such things as regular visits to our school library, a logical mind using number and counting in daily activities, and an enquiring and scientific mind by introducing new and interesting things to explore and investigate.

Our outdoor area provides the opportunity to develop motor skills and co-ordination as well as ball skills and an interest in the natural world.



The children also attend Nursery Praise every month where they gain an understanding of collective worship and enjoy a sense of belonging to their community.

Our curriculum is play based and fun and focuses on the interests of the child. We encourage independent learning wherever possible to ensure that the children are able to undertake daily tasks such as pouring their own milk, putting their own coats on or accessing tools in the creative area.

The areas of learning provide resources and objects of interest to enable children to work within the curriculum at their own level of understanding and with an adult this learning can be extended further according to the child's stage of development. We have a daily circle time to talk about the topic and learning aims of the day. This is then explored further during the session within a focus activity or task with an adult. We operate a free flow play system where children can use the outdoor or indoor area as they choose.

We welcome you as a parent into our nursery and value you as the first educators of your child. We look forward to working together as a partnership to ensure that your child has the best start possible in school life and a very happy and positive nursery experience.





Parents, Teachers, Friends Association

By being a parent, you are already a member of our PTFA. It's called the Friends of Trinity All Saints to reflect the fact that parents, teachers, family members and friends join together to support the school.

The PTFA creates fun and raises funds! Events in the past have been many and varied, from Christmas Fairs, to BBQs, Bingo Nights, Beetle Drives, Movie Nights and many more.
